The CARILEC Lineworkers Rodeo is an annual event that brings together lineworkers from across the region, offering them a unique opportunity to test their technical expertise, safety knowledge, and speed in real-world scenarios. The competition is divided between Apprentice and Experienced Lineworker categories. Apprentice is a **one-man team**, whilst the experienced team comprises of a **three-man team**.

APPRENTICE Lineworker Events

(Apprentices must have 0-5 years as an active Lineworker)

- HV fuse link replacement (Single Phase)
- 1 phase Equipotential Ground (Personal Ground)
 Installation on 40' pole
- Mystery Event
- Pole Speed Climb with an egg on 40' Pole
- Hurt Man Rescue Apprentices/ Single man event

EXPERIENCED Lineworker Events

(More than 5 years as an active lineworker)

- 3-phase Equipotential Ground (Personal ground) Installation on 40' pole
- HT Cutout Installation
- Mystery Event
- Pole Speed Climb with an egg on 40' Pole
- Hurt Man Rescue Experience (Team Event)

NB: Apprentice is a one-man team the experienced team comprise of three-man team

All teams must bring along the following:

- A banner with the utility name and logo to be used for the march pass
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
- Working gloves with cuff that covers wrist
- Helmet with chin strap
- Long sleeve work shirts
- Fall restraint device for climbing

- Utility needs to complete two registration forms available on the website.
- General registration form
- Event and team registration form
- Attend the virtual Participant's Meeting on April 14, 9:00 am.
- Download the rodeo Manual and event score sheets, from CARILEC website
