

### LA SOUFRIÈRE VOLCANO: INFORMATION NOTE #7 – MONDAY 26<sup>TH</sup> APRIL 2021 AS AT 5:00 P.M. AST

#### MESSAGE:

Seismic activity continues to be recorded at the La Soufriere Volcano, but has remained low since the tremor associated with the explosion and ash venting which occured around noon on April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2021. The volcano continues to erupt and its pattern of seismic activity over the last few days is typical of the growth of a lava dome.

# IMMEDIATE EVACUATION ORDERS HAVE BEEN ISSUED AND ACCESS TO THE VOLCANO IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED

#### SITUATION:

Since our previous information note on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> April 2021, The La Soufriere Volcano continues to erupt, with explosive eruptions being reported on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> April at 6:15 a.m. and Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> April at 4:49 p.m. The latter was followed by a high-level tremor and the resulting eruption plume rose to above 8km and drifted to the south and southwest of the island. In addition, the continuous Global Positioning System (GPS) network has shown a change in horizontal and vertical movement since the initial depressurization noted immediately following the April 9 explosive phase. Seismic activity has since continued the patter established on 18<sup>th</sup> April. In the last twenty-four (24) hours, only a few long-period, hybrid and volcano-tectonic earthquakes have been recorded and there have been no further tremors.



#### **RED ALERT LEVEL:**

A Red Level Alert indicates that eruption is in progress or may occur without further warning.

# The following update presents information from the Caribbean Disaster and Emergency Management Agency (CDEMA) participating states or member countries:

#### UPDATES FROM IMPACTED CDEMA PARTICIPATING STATE:

#### NEMO, St. Vincent and The Grenadines:

- 1. 85 public shelters with 4,413 occupants
- 2. 6,790 persons are registered in private shelters
- 3. 1,618 families in private homes
- 4. 1,333 persons in private homes are registered to feed at shelters
- 5. 156 persons sheltered in hotels
- 6. Total of 13,303 persons displaced
- 7. NEMO Emergency contact number: (784) 458 6366

- 10. A dedicated hotline number is established 784-526-3000 to facilitate calls into the EOC.
- 11. A satellite EOC is established next to the main EOC to facilitate relief and shelter management.
- 12. Families living overseas are encouraged to send monetary donations rather than small packages to avoid putting undue stress on the ports to process multiple small packages. Bulk shipping should be done where possible.

#### CARIBBEAN DISASTER AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (CDEMA) ACTIONS:

The CDEMA Coordinating Unit (CU) continues to operate in accordance with the standard operating procedures (SOPs) of the Regional Coordination Plan (RCP) which includes maintaining contact with the threatened states and Regional Response Mechanism (RRM) partners.

- 1. CARICOM Disaster Relief Unit (CDRU), with the assistance of WFP, are in the process of constructing a third Mobile Storage Unit (MSU#3) at the Arnos Vale Logistics Hub.
- 2. The public is being advised to coordinate relief supplies with their National Disaster Office in country, cash donations are recommended, and banking details are provided on page 5.
- 3. European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (EU ECHO) is providing support through 190,000 Euro contribution to International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) DREF, 550,000 Euro to UN and/or Red Cross partners, activation of Copernicus satellite mapping system, and 9 environmental experts.
- 4. World Food Programme (WFP) sent a shipment including surgical masks, face shield, jerry cans, and emergency worker backpacks.
- 5. WFP oriented the CDRU and Cadet Force on the CDEMA Logistic System (CLS) to assist with relief management.
- 6. The World Central Kitchen (WCK) is providing meals for persons in private shelters.
- 7. Adventist Development and Relief Agency International (ADRA) will be providing 1,280 meals per day for one (1) month for 12 shelters.



#### CARILEC Disaster Assistance Programme

- 8. Regional Security System (RSS) is providing security at 7 shelters and 3 satellite relief centres and will also provide security for the Logistics Hub.
- 9. Water Production capability is growing, and work is ongoing to restore a pipe-borne supply to the public. Bottled water distribution continues across the SVG.
- 10. The Detailed Damage Sectoral Analysis (DDSA) report is on track to be delivered next week.
- 11. The CARICOM Operational Support Team (COST) and CDRU, in partnership with WFP, have strengthened coordination and facilitated relief distribution to households.
- 12. Surge support to port operations is planned to improve the efficiency of cargo clearance of the number of solicited and unsolicited items arriving in country.
- 13. CDEMA continues to provide telecommunications (mainly radio) support, though the support of Global Affairs Canada, within the SVG Support Net's 24-hour rotation. Communication has been facilitated between NEMO, RSS, CDRU, SVG Support Amateur Radio Operators, Regional Amateur Radio Operators, and others throughout the CDEMA Participating States. NEMO's system is being used on the ground by the community, health, logistics and mobilisation teams as well as the Seismic Unit.
- 14. Coordinating pledges and donations from CDEMA PS, regional and international partners; daily partner coordination briefings. Please contact the Regional Coordination Center via rccuser@cdema.org.
- 15. The public is being advised to coordinate relief supplies with their National Disaster Office in country.
- 16. Accounts established for direct donations to St. Vincent relief efforts and the regional disaster response fund.
